

LOCAL LAW NO. 4 FOR THE YEAR 1976

A LOCAL LAW REQUIRING TOWN OF AMHERST EMPLOYEES TO BE RESIDENTS OF THE TOWN OF AMHERST

BE ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF AMHERST AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. On and after the effective date of this local law, it shall be the duty of each employee of the Town of Amherst during the period of his or her employment of said Town, to maintain his or her residence or dwelling within the corporate limits of said Town. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any employee during a leave of absence duly granted, nor to an employee principally engaged in Town activities outside the corporate limits of said Town.

Section 2. Any employee who, on the effective date of this local law, does not maintain his or her residence or dwelling within the corporate limits of said Town, shall within the period of one year, from said effective date, maintain a residence or dwelling within the corporate limits of said town.

Section 3. The Town Board of said Town, if after investigation determines that enforcement of the provisions of this local law works an undue hardship upon any employee, may grant such relief to such employee as said Board in its judgment deems just and proper.

Section 4. Failure of any employee to comply with any of the provisions of this local law shall constitute misconduct and shall be cause for removal in the manner provided by law.

Section 5. Provisions of this local law shall not apply to elected officials or other employees whose residence requirements are established by law.

Section 6. This local law shall take effect immediately.
