INTRODUCTION

Introduction

The census is a count of the entire population of the United States. It occurs every ten years – always in a year ending in zero – and is required by the U.S. Constitution. The Census Bureau collects population data for a number of demographics, including, race, age, gender, income, housing, education, transportation, and employment.

Many people and groups use census information, including federal and state government, community leaders and planners, and businesses. Census information is used for many purposes, for example:

- The census count determines the number of congressional representatives assigned to each state (reapportionment).
- Census numbers are used to redraw the boundaries of legislative districts (*redistricting*).
- Federal and state funds supporting schools, employment programs, housing, roads, hospitals, and programs for the elderly are distributed based on census figures.
- Community leaders and planners use census data to help decide where to locate new roads, schools, parks, and help plan for other community services.
- Because census data has been collected for so many years, the census provides useful historical information on demographic changes. For example, planners can study how a town's or city's *population density* has changed over time.
- Businesses use census figures in their planning and decision making for example, to plan investments, analyze trends, and understand consumer needs.

Census data is gathered by sending a survey to each *household* in the country. By law, all individual responses are confidential and are not shared with any other government agency.

Individual responses are then summarized and the data is organized and made available for different geographic areas. For example, census information is organized by state, county, and city. Another important way the census data is organized is by *census tract*. Census tracts are small areas within counties that generally have an average of 4,000 residents.





Figure 2: Census Tracts 2000

Tract boundaries generally remain the same from census to census, allowing people to compare data from several censuses. In some cases, however, minor changes did occur to some of the census tract boundaries for Amherst and Clarence, as shown in Figures 1 and 2. Because Amherst's population is more than four times the size of Clarence's population, Amherst has more census tracts -- twenty-three -- compared to four in Clarence.

The following report provides census information and maps for the Towns of Amherst and Clarence. It compares data from the 1990 and 2000 Census as a way of understanding how the towns have changed in the past decade, how they compare to each other, and how they compare to Erie County. The report covers three main areas:

- > Population
- Age and Gender
- ➤ Households and Families

Figure 1: Census Tracts 1990

The following are useful definitions relating to a census (full definitions are available at www.census.gov):

General

Census tract

Small areas within counties that generally have an average of 4,000 residents for which census information is organized. The boundaries of census tracts generally follow visible physical features, such as roads or streams.

Reapportionment

The redistribution of seats in the U.S. House of Representatives among the states on the basis of population distribution observed during the most recent census.

Redistricting

The process of revising the geographic boundaries of areas from which people elect representatives to the U.S. Congress, a state legislature, a county or city council, or a school board, to meet the legal requirement that such areas be as equal in population as possible following a census.

Population

Total population

Complete count of all persons residing in an area.

Population density

Total population divided by some measure of area. (Example: persons per acre)

Housing Units

Housing unit

A house, apartment, mobile home, or trailer.

Owner-occupied housing unit

A housing unit is owner occupied if the owner or co-owner lives in the unit.

Renter-occupied housing unit

All occupied units that are not owner-occupied are classified as renter-occupied.

Households

Household

A household includes all the people who occupy a housing unit as their usual place of residence.

Householder

The person, or one of the people, in whose name the home is owned or rented.

Household density

Total households divided by some measure of area. (Example: households per acre)

Household size

The total number of people living in a housing unit.

Median household income

The total household income for an area divided by the total number of households.

Family household

A family includes a householder and one or more people living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption.

Non-family household

Household composed of unrelated people or one person living alone.

Group quarters

The Census Bureau classifies all people not living in households as living in group quarters. There are two types of group quarters: institutional (for example, correctional facilities, nursing homes, and mental hospitals) and non-institutional (for example, college dormitories, military barracks, group homes, missions, and shelters).






Total Population

- The Census Bureau reported that Erie County's population decreased from 968,532 in 1990 to 950,265 in 2000, a population decrease of 1.9%.
- The 1990 Census indicated that the Town of Amherst had a population of 111,740. By 2000, that number grew to 116,510, an overall increase of 4%. However, this growth was not evenly distributed (see Table 1 and Figure 3). Some census tracts experienced a decrease in population, while others experienced double-digit percentage increases in population. The greatest percentage increase, 37%,occurred in tract 90.08, in East Amherst. The greatest percentage decrease, -8%, occurred in tract 93.02, in Eggertsville.
- The Census Bureau reported a much larger population increase for the Town of Clarence. The Town's 1990 population of 20,041 increased to 26,123 in 2000, an increase of 30%. The greatest percentage increase, 58%, occurred in tract 146.02, while tract 146.01 had no change.
- The overall pattern of population density for the towns generally remained the same (see Figures 4 and 5).
- Although the County lost population between 1990 and 2000, both townships experienced population growth. This indicates a shift in the population. It is reasonable to assume that the Towns' population increase is attributable to a segment of the population moving out of the more densely built-up areas of Erie County. This shift can also be seen in Amherst, as the more densely populated census tracts experienced population loss. Eight of the nine more densely populated census tracts in Amherst in 1990 experienced a decrease in population in 2000.
- Overall, the towns of Amherst and Clarence represent a larger proportion of Erie County's total population: from 13.6% in 1990 to 15% in 2000.







White Population

- Erie County's greatest population loss is accounted for in white population. A loss of 6.2% was recorded between 1990 and 2000. The 1990 Census reported that 832,129, or 86% of Erie County's population was white. By 2000 that figure had dropped to 780,942 people, or 82% of the population.
- While Eric County lost white population, the Census Bureau reported that the Town of Amherst experienced a slight increase of 0.1%. The population between 1990 and 2000 has risen from 103,923 to 104,018 respectively (see Figures 6 and 7). However, like total population, this increase was not uniform among Amherst's census tracts and ranged from −13.5% to +31% (see Table 2). Again, the largest increase occurred in tract 90.08 in East Amherst, with a 31% increase.
- White population increased in the Town of Clarence. The 1990 population of 19,825 increased to 25,343 in 2000, an increase of 28%. The largest increase that occurred was in tract 146.02. This tract has experienced a significant increase in the number of subdivisions built during the ten year span. Only tract 146.01 experienced a slight decrease in white population.







Black Population

- Erie County experienced a 13% growth of black population between 1990 and 2000. The Census Bureau reported that this population rose from 109,668 in 1990, to 123,529 in 2000.
- Both Amherst and Clarence experienced a larger increase in black population than did Erie County as a whole: 53% and 182%, respectively (see Figures 8 and 9 and Table 3).
- The Town of Amherst had a black population of 2,967 in 1990. This figure grew to 4,544, a 53% increase.
- The Town of Clarence showed a change of 182% in its black population. A black population of 60 in 1990 increased to 169 in the 2000 Census.







Asian Population

- Between 1990 and 2000, Eric County experienced a 41% increase in Asian population. The Asian population grew from 10,002 in 1990 to 14,058 in 2000.
- Amherst experienced a similar increase to that of Erie County, with a 43% increase in the Asian population during the decade. However, some census tracts experienced significantly larger increases, while others showed decreases (see Table 4). The largest changes occurred in tracts.96.00 and 90.08, with increases of 915% and 725%, respectively (see Figures 10 and 11).
- Clarence showed a substantially larger percentage increase than either Erie County or the Town of Amherst. The Asian population grew from 130 in 1990 to 372 in the 2000 Census, a 186% change in population. Only tract 146.01 experienced a decrease in Asian population.







Other Populations

- Other populations are considered to include, but are not limited to, Indian, Aleut, and mixed races.
- In Eric County, other populations included 16,733 people in 1990. This category experienced a slight increase as it grew to 19,254 by 2000, an increase of 15%.
- The Town of Amherst experienced a decrease of 1% in this segment of the population, from 581 in 1990 to 573 in 2000. Like the other population demographics, the changes in other populations varied greatly by census tract, ranging from -73% to 256% (see Table 5 and Figures 12 and 13).
- In the Town of Clarence, this population segment increased from 26 in 1990 to 93 in 2000, an increase of 258%. The largest increase occurred in tract 146.01, with 400%, while tracts 147.01 and 147.02 were unchanged.

Population Pyramids

A population pyramid is a diagram that shows the age and gender distribution of a population. Each horizontal bar on the chart shows the number of males and females in an age group. Population pyramids display the history of an area's population growth. They also provide important information to government leaders and planners because people of different ages have different needs. For example, a large proportion of the population under age eighteen may require that more schools be built, or a population with many elderly will need more health care facilities.




Figure 15: Population Pyramid for the Nation (2000)

- Figures 14 and 15 show the population pyramids for the nation in 1990 and 2000. The charts are generally larger on the bottom and narrower on the top, as the death rate is higher among older people than younger people. The largest age categories, however, occur in the middle of the chart. In 2000, the largest age group was thirty to thirty-nine years old.




Figure 16: Populatuion Pyramid for Erie County (1990)









Figure 17: Population Pyramid for Erie County (2000)

- The population pyramids for Erie County are shown in Figures 16 and 17. The charts follow the same general pattern as those of the nation. However, Erie County does have a larger percentage of its population at the top of the chart, indicating an aging population. In 2000, the largest age group was forty to forty-nine years old.
- Figures 18 and 20 show the population pyramids for the Town of Amherst in 1990 and 2000. These charts follow the same general pattern as those for Erie County. In 1990, the largest age group was thirty to thirty-nine years old. In 2000, the largest age group was forty to forty-nine years old. Also, a larger percentage of the population is in the seventy to seventy-nine and eighty and older age groups.
- The population pyramids for the Town of Clarence are shown in Figures 19 and 21. In 1990, the largest age group was forty to forty-nine years old. In 2000, this age group was again the largest group.

More detailed information for each age group category and for gender is provided in the following text, tables, and figures.

Figure 14: Population Pyramid for the Nation (1990)

Under 1 to 4 Years

- The Census Bureau reported that the nation had an increase of 10% in the population segment of under one to four years of age. The population increased from 17,264,096 in 1990 to 19,046,754 in 2000.
- A loss of 14,801was reported in the under one to four population for Erie County, a decrease of 22%. In 1990, Erie County had 66,651 people under one to four years and this decreased to 51,850 by 2000.
- The 2000 Census reported that the Town of Amherst had a decrease of 858 people under one to four years, a decrease of 12%. The population changed from 7,089 in 1990 to 6,231 in 2000.
- The Town of Clarence experienced an increase in the under one to four year old population segment. The Census Bureau reported that there were 1,301 people in 1990 and 1,608 by 2000, an increase of 24%.


- The percentage of males and females remained fairly constant in the Towns of Amherst and Clarence from 1990 to 2000 (see Table 17 and Figures 22 25).

Total number of households

- The Census Bureau reported an increase of 1% in the total number of households for Erie County between 1990 and 2000. The number of households increased from 376,994 in 1990 to 380,873 in 2000.
- The total number of households for 1990 and 2000 for the towns of Amherst and Clarence are shown in Figures 26 and 27. Both towns experienced a greater increase in the number of households for the decade than did Erie County.
- The Town of Amherst was reported to have an increase of 9.3%. The total number of households increased from 41,252 in 1990 to 45,076 in 2000. Overall, census tracts in Amherst ranged from a gain of 70.2% (tract 90.08), to a loss of 3.5% (tract 93.02), as shown in Table 18 and Figure 28.
- The Census Bureau reported a higher increase of 30.8% for the Town of Clarence. In 1990, Clarence was reported to have 76,025 households, and by 2000, this number increased to 84,016. All but one census tract, 146.01, were reported to have double-digit percentage increases in the number of households.
- Overall, the towns of Amherst and Clarence represent a larger proportion of Erie County's total households: from 12.8% in 1990 to 14.2% in 2000.

Household Density

- The average household density for the Town of Amherst in 1990 was 1.8 households per acre. This increased to 1.9 households per acre by 2000. The Town of Clarence had a lower household density than that of Amherst: 0.3 households per acre in 1990 and 0.4 in 2000.
- Household density varied by census tract (see Figures 29 and 30). For both 1990 and 2000, census tract 90.03 had the lowest rate of households per acre in the Town of Amherst (0.3 in 1990 and 0.4 in 2000, while census tract 93.01 had the highest (4.6 in 1990 and 4.9 in 2000).
- All census tracts in the Town of Clarence had an average of less than one household per acre for both 1990 and 2000.


■ The average household size for both towns decreased during the decade. In 1990, the average household size for Amherst was 2.71, and it decreased to 2.58 by 2000. The average household size for Clarence was higher than that of Amherst. It declined slightly during the decade, from 2.86 in 1990 to 2.85 in 2000 (see Figures 31 and 32).




- In 1990, family households accounted for 72.2% of all households in the Town of Amherst and this decreased to 66.1% by 2000. Non-family households increased to 33.9% of all households by 2000 (see Figures 33 36).
- In the Town of Clarence, family households accounted for 81.1% of all households in 1990 and this also decreased by 2000, to 78.2%. Non-family households increased to 21.8% of all households by 2000.
- The percentage of the population living in group quarters increased for the Town of Amherst during the decade, from 5.4% to 6.3%. The census tract with the greatest percentage gain, 9.4%, was 91.12 (see Figures 37 39).
- The percentage of the population living in group quarters decreased slightly for the Town of Clarence. In 1990, 2.0% of the population lived in group quarters, and by 2000, 1.9% did.










































Housing Units

- The Census Bureau reported that the number of housing units in Erie County increased from 402,131 in 1990 to 415,868 in 2000, an increase of 3.4%.
- The Town of Amherst had an increase of 8.1% in housing units. Amherst increased from 43,316 in 1990 to 46,803 in 2000. The Town's largest increase of 42.5% was in tract 90.08 (the Maple-Ayer-Klein area) (see Table 19 and Figures 40 and 41).
- Clarence was reported to have a larger increase, from 79,561 in 1990 to 87,221 in 2000, an increase of 9.6%. The largest increase of 59.9% was reported in tract 146.02, along Transit Road north of Sheridan Drive.







Owner Occupied Housing

- The Census Bureau also reported that Erie County saw an increase in the number of owner occupied housing units. In 1990, there were 240,246 owner occupied houses, increasing to 248,767 in 2000, giving the county an increase of 3.5%.
- The number of owner occupied housing units also increased in the Town of Amherst. The census reported there were 30,946 owner occupied houses in 1990 and the number increased to 33,349 in 2000, an increase of 7.8%. Tracts 90.06 and 90.07 both increased the number of housing units by 27% (see Table 20 and Figures 42 and 43).
- The Town of Clarence was reported to have a larger increase in the number of owner occupied housing units. Clarence increased from 6,027 in 1990 to 8,041 in 2000, or a 33.4% increase over the decade. The highest increase of 66.7% occurred in tract 146.02.
- The Town of Amherst made up 12.9% of Erie County's home owners in 1990 and in 2000 the percentage increased to 13.4%. In 1990, the Town of Clarence had 2.5% of Erie County's home owners and this increased to 3.2% in 2000.







Renter Occupied Housing

- Erie County was reported by the Census Bureau as having a decrease in the number of renter occupied housing units between 1990 and 2000. Renters fell from 136,748 in 1990 to 132,106 in 2000, a decrease of 3.4%.
- The U.S. Census did report an increase in the number of renters in the Town of Amherst. The town was reported as having 10,387 rental units in 1990 and 11,727 in 2000, an increase of 12.9%. A large increase of 244% was reported for tract 90.08 (see Table 21 and Figures 44 and 45).
- Renter occupied housing in Clarence increased from 940 units in 1990 to 1,113 in 2000, and increase of 18.4%. The largest increase of 60.3% was in tract 146.01, located at the southwest corner of town.
- The Census Bureau reported that Amherst had 7.6% of Erie County's renters in 1990 and that number increased to 8.9% for 2000.
- The Town of Clarence had 0.7% of the County's renter's in 1990 and increased to 0.8% for 2000.

Median Income

- The Census Bureau reported that Erie County had an increase in median income. In 1990, median income for the county was \$28,005 and it increased to \$38,567 in 2000, a 37.7% increase.
- Amherst was reported to have a similar increase during the ten year period. The Census Bureau reported median income to be \$41,466 in 1990 and \$55,427 by 2000, an increase of 33.7% (See Table 22 and Figures 46 and 47).
- The Census Bureau reported a 52% increase in median income for the Town of Clarence. Median income was reported to be \$44,740 in 1990 and went up to \$68,003 for the 2000 Census.
- The household median income for Amherst was 148% of the household median income of Erie County's household median income as a whole in 1990 and decreased to 144% in 2000.
- Clarence's household median income was 160% of Erie County's household median income in 1990 and the percentage increased to 176% for 2000.
