

AMHERST EARNS 2024 TREE CITY USA RECOGNITION FROM ARBOR DAY FOUNDATION

Community Forestry Management Plan Acknowledged

(Amherst, NY) – The Town of Amherst has been named a 2024 Tree City USA by the Arbor Day Foundation in honor of its commitment to plan, grow and maintain trees to benefit its community. Additionally, the Town Board unanimously acknowledged the recommendations of the Community Forestry Management Plan as the Town's vision for forestry operations and as a comprehensive tree plan.

"The Town of Amherst is proud to once again be named a Tree City USA. Our commitment to good forestry practices goes back decades, and we continue today to outline a Community



Forestry Management Plan that provides a strategy for meeting the tree and forestry needs of the community," said Councilmember Angela Marinucci.

The Arbor Day Foundation is a global nonprofit with a mission to inspire people to plant, nurture, and celebrate trees. Its network of more than a million supporters and partners has helped the organization plant more than 500 million trees in forests and communities across more than 60 countries since 1972. The Tree City USA program has recognized cities and towns that leverage urban forestry to enhance the livability and sustainability of their local area for over 50 years.

"We all have a role to play in shaping our future and tree champions like Amherst are leading the way," said Michelle Saulnier, Vice President of Programs at the Arbor Day Foundation. "Trees are critical infrastructure, building resiliency and fostering good health in our nation's cities. We're proud Amherst is among the Arbor Day Foundation's growing network of communities dedicated to creating positive impact through trees."

In cities and neighborhoods, trees are proven to help mitigate the urban heat island effect, reduce stormwater runoff, improve air quality, and boost mental and physical health. When the right trees are planted in the right places, they can also reduce traffic noise, increase property values, and lower energy costs for homeowners.

To earn Tree City USA recognition, a city must uphold four core standards including maintaining a tree board or department, having a community tree ordinance, spending at least \$2 per capita on urban forestry, and participating in an Arbor Day celebration.

The Arbor Day Foundation's Tree City USA program is operated in partnership with the National Association of State Foresters and the USDA Forest Service.
