April 17, 2025

Carol Ann Harlos is an award-winning retired math and science teacher, Master Gardener, Master Naturalist, beekeeper, writer, and speaker. She tends extensive gardens and loves learning from others as well as sharing her knowledge. "The Wonderful World of Herbs" will cover the history, some botany, uses, and anecdotes of some of the world's most interesting herbs.

Blue Star Mothers have children currently serving or who have honorably served in the United States Armed Forces. The local chapter, New York 7, represents the Buffalo-Niagara region of New York State. Alan Nowicki is the Director of Programming at the National Historic Landmark, Roycroft Campus. He has 20 years of experience working in professional development and community outreach and has been a teacher for more than 25 years, having taught in every grade level from Pre-K through college, specializing in art and history. He is a regular speaker at local schools, libraries, churches, and historical sites around Western New York. Recent presentations have included talks at the Buffalo History Museum, Iowa State University, the Folger Shakespeare Conference, and the Smithsonian. Come hear the stories of the rise, fall and rebirth of this National Historic Landmark, right here in Western New York.

- Manages the *Painted Traffic Box* initiative of selecting artists who apply to design and paint traffic boxes located throughout the Town of Amherst. Since 2019, there have been 33 traffic boxes creatively hand painted. Eight more will be painted this summer;
- Coordinates an arts and cultural grant funding application process and makes recommendations for approval to the Town Board; and
