The Town of Amherst Youth & Recreation Department is pleased to provide an updated Memory Tree program to those who wish to memorialize a loved one by having a tree planted in one of our many town parks. Each fee includes the cost of the tree, a memorial stone, custom plaque, and gator bag.

Memory trees are guaranteed for (1) year. Should the tree become damaged or diseased, the purchaser is responsible for replacing the tree after the guarantee period expires. Should the tree become damaged or diseased, and is not replaced by the purchaser, the Town reserves the right to remove the tree and will deliver the stone and plaque to the original purchaser, or the alternate contact noted in the application. Please follow the attached Tree Maintenance Guidelines and Suggestions. The trees are not memorials and <u>may not</u> be decorated with flowers, ribbons, photos, lights, wind chimes or any other items. Scattering of cremated remains is prohibited.

Total cost of the memory tree is **\$1,000.00**.

A representative from the Youth & Recreation department will contact the purchaser when payment has been received. One application per tree. Please allow 7-14 days for payment to be received and processed before confirmation is made.

Please note, there is ONE planting date/event per year, typically in the fall. Your tree will be planted during this event, not as it is received. *The deadline for application and payment submission for the*2024 planting event is August 1, 2024. Any application received after this time will be processed for the Fall 2024 planting date. A representative will contact purchaser when trees have been planted, and the stone and plaque are available for pickup and placement. It is the responsibility of the purchaser to pick-up the stone and plaque from the Youth & Recreation Department and place at the tree.

For 2024, the only parks available are: Billy Wilson Park, Paradise Park, Bedford/Willow Ridge Park, Eggertsville Community Park, Cindy Drive Play Area, and North Forest Park. Refer to the attached maps for available locations in each park. Applications are processed as they are received, and maps are updated accordingly as trees are purchased. Please contact the Youth & Recreation Department to request the most recent updated maps if you are unsure of the availability of your preferred location.

Should you desire a different park, please check back with us in 2024.

Tree Maintenance Guidelines and Suggestions

The Town of Amherst follows NYS DEC best practices for tree maintenance and pruning. Below, please find some general suggestions on caring for your tree. If you have any general questions, please reach out to the Youth & Recreation Department. The Town of Amherst is not responsible for the care and/or maintenance of trees purchased through the Memory Tree Program, and the following information is only meant as a suggestion guide.

Pruning and Maintenance

Care and maintenance of urban trees ensures their health life and minimizes liability. Trees can be damaged by high winds, snow, ice, and other severe weather events. Some damage requires immediate attention, while other damage may be dealt with later. The primary concern for maintaining trees is safety - safety of the people who live near the tree and safety of anyone working to maintain and prune a tree.

For any work that requires a chain saw or cannot be performed from ground level, please contact the Youth & Recreation Department for guidance on how to proceed.

When weighing the options of whether to prune or maintain your tree here are several things to consider:

- Be conservative: In the event of damage from storms and weather, clean up anything that imposes
 an immediate threat or risk while evaluating the tree. Do not prune or remove more than necessary
 right after the damage has occurred. Damaged trees may still be able to serve the function they were
 planted for, and removal may be able to be delayed. Trees are stronger than you think and the
 damage may not be as bad as it first appears.
- If the tree is badly damaged and must be removed consider replacing it.
- Trees should be watered regularly, in particular, during times of drought. Information on required or recommended water can be found by searching the type of tree and the zone you have planted in.
 Additionally, memory trees come with gator bags (slow drip watering bag) which will need to be filled regularly.
